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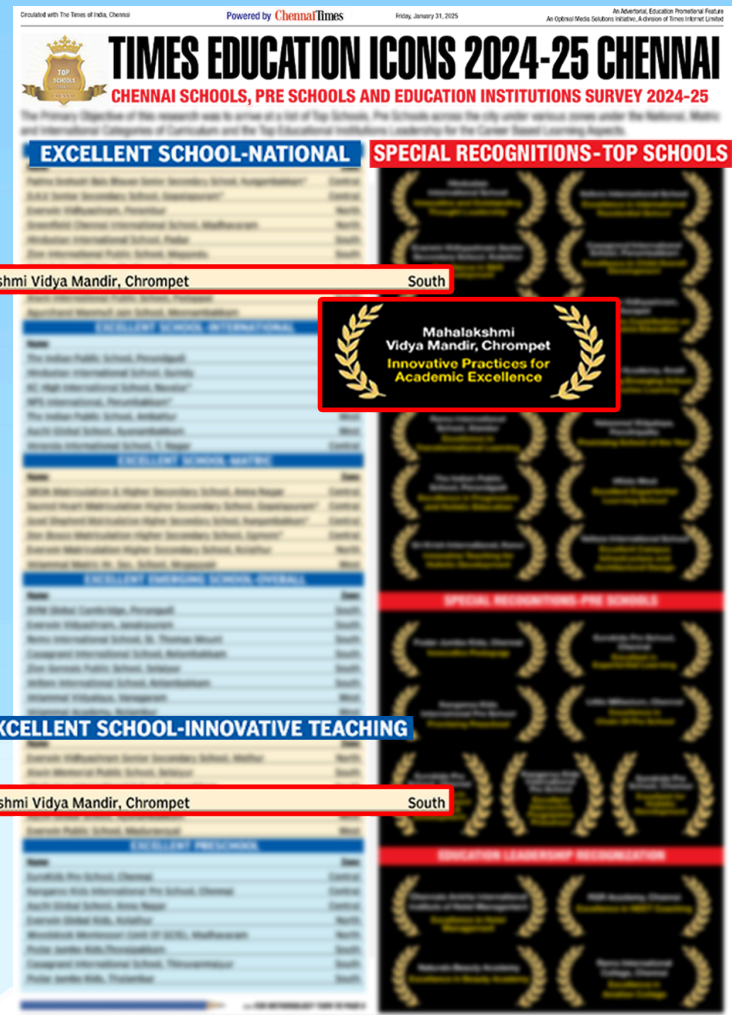

# CHRYSALIS DAY: SHOWCASING SKILLS WITH JOY



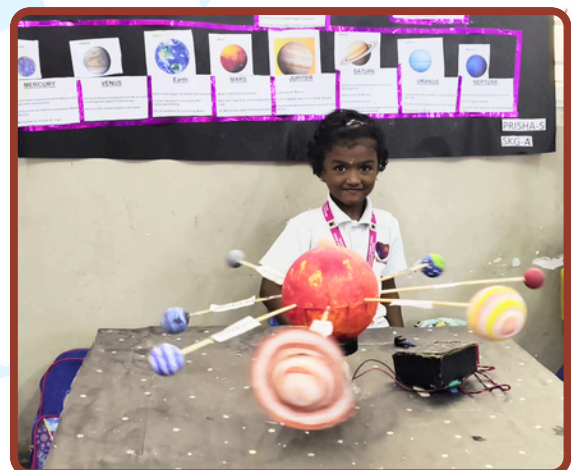
## *A Colorful Celebration of Early Learning*

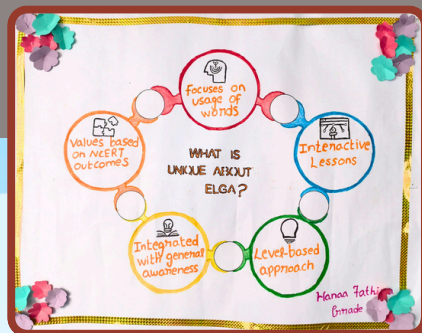




# LEADERSHIP IN ACTION: STUDENT LED CONFERENCE AT MAHALAKSHMI VIDYA MANDIR

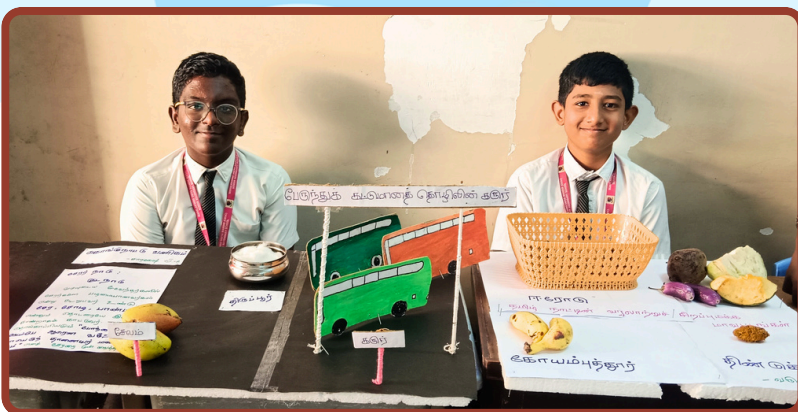
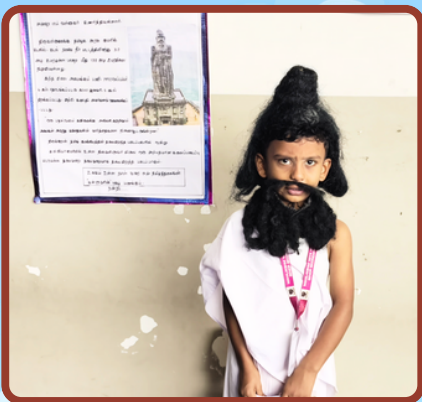
## *Empowering Voices, Showcasing Growth*

Unlike traditional parent-teacher meetings, the Student Led Conference allowed each child to:

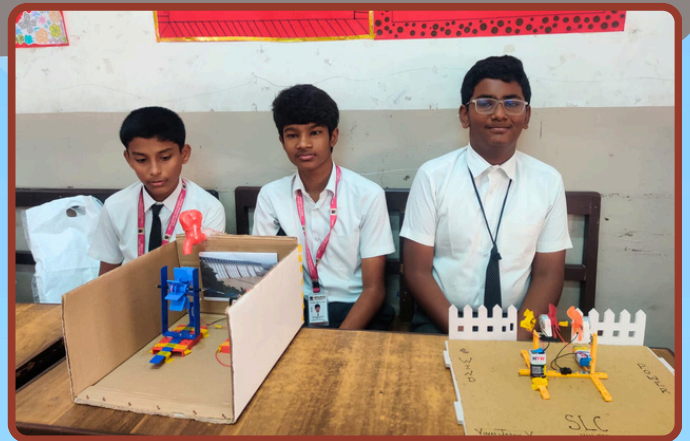
- Demonstrate their learning in subjects like English, Math, Science, and EVS through interactive activities.

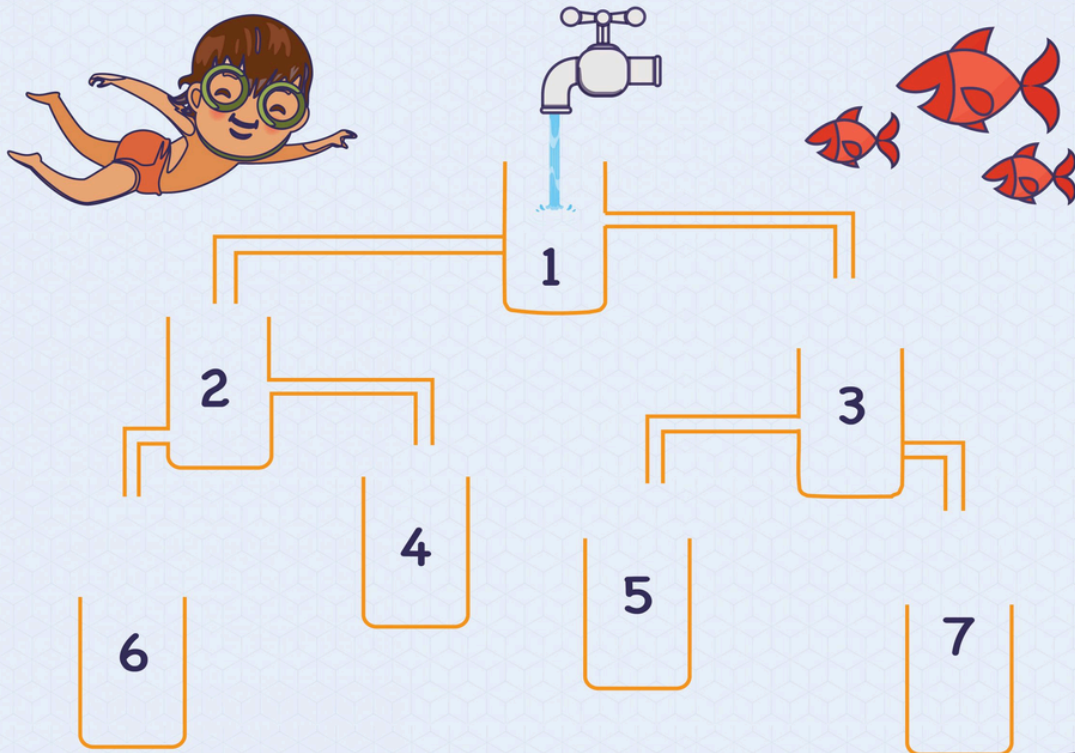
The Principal addressed the gathering, encouraging students to believe in their hard work and face the exams with a calm and focused mind.
